

<p><b>Artificial colours-</b> colours that don't exist in nature, created by humans</p> <p><b>Natural colours-</b> colours that exist in nature</p> <p><b>Line-</b> a mark made using a pencil or brush.</p> <p><b>Mark making-</b> different lines/patterns to add detail, texture and depth.</p> <p><b>Pastels-</b> made of powdered pigments and resin</p> <p><b>Shading-</b> gives the illusion of depth._</p> <p><b>Style -</b> characteristic way of painting</p> <p><b>Subdued colours-</b> soft, toned down_</p> <p><b>Texture-</b> the feel/ appearance of a surface</p> <p><b>Tone-</b> light and dark shades of a colour</p> <p><b>Watercolour-</b> water soluble paint</p>		<p>Rosalind Monks is a British illustrator who takes her inspiration from the natural world. She produces very detailed drawings of creatures such as bugs and birds and fills them with intricate patterns.
